

Sanitation Collection Administrative Regulation

Objective: These rules are intended to meet the requirement to promulgate reasonable rules for the daily operations of the City of Longview Sanitation services by the Director of Public Works for the City of Longview, Texas. Those requirements are found in Section 49-3 of the Longview Code of Ordinances.

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I. General

The accumulation of residential or commercial garbage, rubbish, junk and other deleterious substances on the premises of private residences, commercial institutions, and in streets and alleys constitutes a public menace and nuisance and greatly increases the danger of the spread of infectious, contagious, and epidemic diseases. It is imperative and urgent for the preservation of health, safety, sanitation, peace, and public welfare that proper and adequate regulations be adopted to require property owners, tenants, occupants or lessees to properly participate in the city's sanitation collection system.

II. Definitions

The following terms as herein defined shall control in the construction and enforcement of this policy:

Assisted Collection Customer – A residence where occupants are certified by a licensed medical doctor or orthopedic physician as being physically incapable of transporting their residential garbage or recyclables to the curb.

Brush – Cuttings or trimmings from trees or shrubs and similar materials.

Bulky item – Any non-putrescible waste item(s) over 4 feet in length and not listed as an excluded item in Section IX Residential and Commercial Bulky Item Service.

Bundle – Tree, shrub, and brush trimmings securely tied together forming an easily handled package not exceeding three (3) cubic feet in volume, or 50 lbs. in weight, or four (4) feet in length.

City – The City of Longview, Texas.

Collection – The act of removing residential and commercial garbage or recyclables for transport elsewhere.

Collection Cart – City-owned container used for the collection of residential and commercial garbage and/or recyclables.

Commercial garbage – Garbage or rubbish generated by stores, offices, restaurants, warehouses, and other nonmanufacturing activities, excluding residential and industrial waste.

Construction/demolition waste – Waste resulting from construction, remodeling, repair or demolition operations projects; including all materials that are directly or indirectly the by-product of construction work or that result from the demolition of buildings and other structures, including, but not limited to, paper, cartons, gypsum board, lumber, excelsior, rubber, and plastics.

Garbage – Waste consisting of putrescible animal and vegetable waste materials resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking, and consumption of food, including waste materials from markets, storage facilities, handling, and sale of produce and other food products.

Hazardous waste – Any waste identified or listed as a hazardous waste by the administrator of the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) pursuant to the

federal Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, 42 USC, §6901 et seq, as amended.

Industrial waste – Garbage and rubbish resulting from or incidental to any process of industry or manufacturing, or mining or agricultural operations.

Personal Container – A personally owned metal or plastic can or receptacle labeled “yard waste” that is used for the storage and collection of yard waste with handles of sufficient strength to allow for collection.

Plastic Bags – Plastic sacks designed to store residential garbage and having sufficient wall strength to maintain physical integrity when lifted by the top. The total weight of a bag and its contents shall not exceed 50 lbs.

Putrescible waste – Organic wastes, such as garbage, wastewater treatment plant sludge, and grease trap waste, that are capable of being decomposed by microorganisms with sufficient rapidity as to cause odors or gases or are capable of providing food for or attracting birds, animals, and disease vectors.

Recyclables – Material that has been recovered or diverted from the nonhazardous waste stream for purposes of reuse, recycling, or reclamation, a substantial portion of which is consistently used in the manufacture of products that may otherwise be produced using raw or virgin materials.

Residential garbage – Any garbage or rubbish derived from a residential unit (as the term “residential unit” is defined in this administrative regulation); the term does not include yard waste, brush, or recyclables that are completely free of any other waste.

Residential unit – A dwelling within the corporate limits of the city capable of housing up to four single-family units.

Rubbish – Non-putrescible waste (excluding ashes), consisting of both combustible and noncombustible waste materials. Combustible rubbish includes paper, rags, cartons, wood, excelsior, furniture, rubber, plastics, brush, or similar materials; noncombustible rubbish includes glass, crockery, tin cans, aluminum cans, and similar materials that will not burn at ordinary incinerator temperatures (1,600 degrees Fahrenheit to 1,800 degrees Fahrenheit).

Yard Waste – Leaves, grass clippings, yard and garden debris, and brush, including clean woody vegetative materials not greater than three inches in diameter, and no longer than four feet in length that results from landscaping maintenance and land-clearing operations. The term does not include stumps, roots, or shrubs with intact root balls.

Yard Waste Bags — Paper sacks designed to store leaves, pine needles and other yard waste. The total weight of a bag and its contents shall not exceed 50 lbs.

III. Residential and Commercial Garbage and Recycling

- 1) The city shall collect residential garbage, commercial garbage, and recyclables once weekly at each customer location.
- 2) Residential and commercial garbage and recyclables shall be placed at the curb for collection no earlier than 6:00 p.m. the day before the collection is scheduled and no later than 7:30 a.m. on the day of collection.
- 3) Rocks, dirt, tires or hazardous waste will not be accepted. If unauthorized materials are collected undetected, they will be returned to the owner. Hazardous waste shall be handled in accordance with the terms of all applicable city ordinances, state and federal laws and regulations. The provisions of this section shall not apply to hazardous waste and nothing herein shall be construed as an attempted regulation of hazardous waste collection, handling or disposal.
- 4) Heavy dead animals, such as cows, horses and mules, shall be disposed of by and at the expense of the owner, or persons having same in charge, in the manner and by the method directed by the Environmental Health Division.
- 5) The Sanitation Division will offer near home collection for assisted collection customers as defined. Assisted collection customers must have all of their garbage in plastic bags. Recyclables must be clean and loose. Carts must be accessible to the sanitation workers.

IV. Residential and Commercial Garbage and Recycling Carts

- 1) The City of Longview shall provide a collection cart for the collection of residential and commercial garbage and another for recyclables. City-provided collection carts remain the property of the City of Longview and must not be removed from the service location.
- 2) Customers are required to place all garbage and recyclables in the city provided carts.

- 3) Additional carts, 95 and 35 gallon, are available for the "Additional Cart Fee".
- 4) The cart placed for collection must not be so heavy as to cause the equipment to fail to lift and dump properly. Carts and waste should weigh less than seventy five (75) pounds.
- 5) Garbage and recycling carts and any unaccepted garbage or recyclables, shall be stored in as inconspicuous a location as possible, such as:
 - a) In a garage;
 - b) In an outdoor storage building;
 - c) On the side of a structure on the property; or
 - d) At the back of a structure on the property.

At no point shall a garbage or recycling storage cart or unaccepted garbage or recyclables be stored in public view or remain in public view in the front yard, on the front porch, or in front of the main structure on the property.

- 6) If a customer has a city provided collection cart at the curb on a day other than the collection day for that area and a neighbor in that area has made a complaint to the Sanitation Division, the following procedure will go into effect:
 - a) If a cart is left out the day after collection a tag will be placed on the cart outlining proper times of cart placement for collection. The tag will explain the cart return fee, and give notice that the cart must be removed from the curb within 24 hours to prevent the cart return service from being automatically provided.
 - b) If after 24 hours the collection cart is still located at the curb, the cart will be moved from the curb to the home at the location. A cart return fee will be added to the customer's Sanitation bill for that location.
- 7) Placement for Collection:
 - a) Each collection cart shall be placed curbside for collection. Curbside refers to that portion of the right-of-way adjacent to paved or traveled city roadways (including alleys).

- b) Where no curb is available, residential garbage and recyclables shall be placed so as to be easily visible and not more than four (4) feet from the edge of the roadway. Residential garbage, recyclables, and bulky items or commercial garbage and recyclables are not to be placed in ditch lines and must be on the roadway side of ditches.
- c) Carts shall be placed as close to the roadway as practicable without interfering with or endangering the movement of vehicles or pedestrians, with the handle pointed towards the residence.
- d) When construction work is being performed in the right-of-way, carts, yard waste bags, and bulky items shall be placed as close as practicable to an access point for the collection vehicle.
- e) Carts must not be blocked by vehicles or other obstructions.
- f) Cart lids must be closed.
- g) Collection Carts must have 4 ft to each side of the cart for collection to be made. This includes but is not limited to mailboxes, poles, walls, fences, or other collection carts.

V. Holiday Collection Schedule

- 1) Items may be placed outside of the cart the week after Thanksgiving and next collection day following Christmas to assist with the extra amount of garbage and recyclables that are generated during these times.
- 2) The Collections Section of the Sanitation Division takes three (3) holidays a year.

VI. Yard Waste

- 1) Yard waste will be collected weekly on the same day as customers garbage and recycling collection.
- 2) Plastic bags with yard waste will not be collected as part of the free yard waste service.
- 3) Yard waste in plastic bags can be collected for a fee as part of our bulky item program.
- 4) Yard waste must be in paper bags or a personal container labeled "Yard Waste." In order to avoid spillage, the paper bags must have the top properly

closed and secured in the manner in which the bag is designed to be closed and secured.

- 5) Brush and limbs are collected as part of the yard waste collection service only if they are bundled together with biodegradable twine for easy handling and each bundle is less than four (4) feet in length and limbs of less than 3 inches in diameter.
- 6) Yard waste is limited to 8 cubic yards per customer per week.

VII. Recycling Program

- 1) The provided recycling carts are for recyclable material only. Recycling carts used for any purpose other than recycling as a part of the City Recycling Program will not be collected.
- 2) Recycling carts containing garbage will be tagged. The following week if the recycle cart contains garbage then the recycle cart will be removed.
- 3) Recyclable material will be collected on the same day as residential and commercial garbage.
- 4) The following material can be collected as part of the City Recycling Program.

Plastic

#1 - #2 plastics that are clear or colored.

Paper, Newsprint, and Cardboard

Paper

Newspapers

Magazines (glossy paper is acceptable)

Cardboard

Metal

Clean aluminum, tin or steel beverage or food cans may be recycled (paper labels need not be removed).

VIII. Compost Facility

- 1) The Compost Site is available for the disposal of limbs, brush, tree trunks, leaves, grass clippings, pine straw, and other biodegradable yard waste.

- 2) Compost hours of operation shall be Tuesday thru Saturday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The compost facility will observe normal City of Longview holidays unless the holiday falls on a Monday, then the holiday will be taken on Tuesday.
- 3) The compost is located at 2020 Swinging Bridge Rd, Longview, TX 75604
- 4) Compost material will be accepted free of charge from residential units only.
- 5) Compost material will be accepted for a fee for all commercial and non-residential customers.
- 6) There is no limit on the number of loads that can be brought to the compost site by residential customers, but each load requires proof of residential Sanitation service. (City of Longview current water bill) and a matching Driver's License.
- 7) Compost and mulch can be picked up as available by residential Sanitation customers. Proof of Sanitation service is required to pick up compost or mulch.
- 8) Leaves, grass clippings, pine straw, and other yard waste must be removed from plastic bags before leaving at the compost site.
- 9) Limbs or tree trunks must be no longer than 10 feet and no greater in diameter than 24 inches.
- 10)The compost site allows for the drop off of residential garbage, recyclables, and glass by Sanitation Residential customers at no cost.
- 11)The following items will not be accepted at the compost site:
 - cross ties
 - rocks
 - concrete
 - construction-demolition waste
 - pallets
 - sheetrock
 - ceramic tile
 - roofing material
 - landscape timbers
 - lumber of any type

- fence posts
- metal
- appliances
- tires

12) The Compost Site reserves the right to refuse any load.

IX. Residential and Commercial Bulky Item Service

- 1) Each residential Sanitation address is provided with four (4) bulky item collections per rolling twelve (12) month period as part of the basic service. Collection is limited to no more than eight (8) cubic yards per collection. If bulky items remain following the collection of the eight (8) cubic yards by the Sanitation Division, the remaining bulky items must be removed from the curb until another collection is scheduled with the Sanitation Division. Customers may request an "Additional Bulky Item Pickup" for a fee.
- 2) Commercial Bulky Item Collection is provided for a fee to businesses that have City of Longview water service.
- 3) Residential and commercial customers must schedule a bulky item collection by filling out a form online, sending a CitySend request or by calling Sanitation at 903-237-1250.
- 4) No bulky items shall be placed curbside before the day prior to collection.
- 5) Customers must separate limbs and brush from other bulky items.
- 6) By placing bulky items at the curb the customer has authorized Sanitation to pick up items. This will count towards the 4 annual free collections. If there are no free collections available the collection fee will be charged to the customer's monthly Sanitation bill.
- 7) Brush must not be longer than ten (10) feet and more than 24 inches in diameter.
- 8) Unauthorized materials that are collected undetected will be returned to the owner.
- 9) The following items can be collected for a fee.

Residential or commercial garbage that is not bagged

Cross ties
Construction-demolition waste
Concrete
Pallets
Ceramic tile
Sheetrock
Landscape timbers
Treated Lumber
Mattresses and appliances - \$20 per item

10)The following items cannot be collected as part of the free or fee based bulky item collection service.

Liquids
Hazardous Materials
Tires will not be accepted. If tires are collected undetected, they will be returned to the owner.
An item containing or having contained refrigerant (Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioning unit, etc.)
Dirt, rock, or sand.
Roofing Material
